## 865 (Portlethen) Squadron

The cadets from 865 Squadron have been kept busy the last few months developing their skills in various training camps. Members of our unit have travelled to Barry Buddon and RAF Lossiemouth for

training in several of our core activities, Including:

- · First Aid Cadets have learned basic first aid skills including the recovery position, CPR and dealing with bleeding. On some of the more advanced courses cadets look at treating choking, burns, hypo & hyperthermia, poisoning and allergic reactions.
- Radio Communications Cadets learn basic NATO radio procedures which are useful should the cadets join one of the services someday. These procedures are also useful for cadets interested in becoming Pilots or Air Traffic Controllers.
- · Cyber Security Cadets learn about cyber security in RAF Air Cadets courses, we also have instructors who can deliver courses from GCHQ, including the Cyberfirst Adventurer course.
- Leadership and teamwork Leadership and teamwork are some of the most important aspects of training in the RAF Air Cadets. Our bespoke courses introduce cadets to the type of leadership training delivered in the UK Armed Forces, and gives our members the opportunity for practical leadership experience.
- · Shooting Our cadets have the opportunity to fire Air Rifles locally. On these training camps cadets can have the chance to fire full bore rifles, including the L98A2.





 Fieldcraft - Fieldcraft is becoming a more widespread activity for Air Cadets in our local area. Cadets are introduced to camouflage and concealment techniques, moving as part of a patrol, becoming a sentry and how to cook in the field.

If you think you need door-to-door transport you may qualify. We can take you anywhere within Portlethen e.g. shopping, medical centre, the library or to connect onto another bus service. You can ask for a trip at any time between 9.45 and 13.30 hrs, but you will need to fit in with other passengers. Phone us to find out more about the service.

All passengers have to be registered as an A2B member.

All trips must be pre-booked. Bookings can be made up to 7 days in advance, or up to 14 days for a medical appointment.

#### **Our Group's Projects -**

#### **Portlethen Moss - Local Nature Conservation Site (LNCS)**

For the third year in a row the invasive knotweed has been treated. There was very little regrowth and the hope is that it will soon be totally eradicated.

By the end of 2022, we will have planted more bulbs and some juniper trees at the main entrance to the moss.

We continue to keep the gorse in check where possible and the same goes for the non-native spruce trees that are shooting up all over the moss and drying it out. We also continue to carry out peatland restoration work to keep the peat alive.



Our Moss is a very special place and we're so lucky to have a living peatland on our doorsteps, albeit only a tiny remnant of what it once was before all the development right up until the 1990's.

Did you know that peat stores up to 30 times more carbon per hectare than a healthy tropical rainforest and holds 10 times its weight in water which helps to prevent flooding?

#### **Community Woodland**

This year we were really happy with the two new signs we purchased for the woodland (<u>see</u> opposite page) and thanks very much to Aberdeenshire Council for installing them for us.

The memorial orchard had a very fruitful year with a great harvest of soft fruits in particular. We've given it a tidy up for winter and trimmed the hedge.

Over the next few months, we will be busy developing a small wild-life garden area in the woodland, we have some great ideas for it and will have some super 'structures'. That's all I'm saying you'll have to come and see for yourself....

Into 2023, we plan to start a great new community project that's been on the back burner for a while. More about that in the next edition.....

### Saving Our Endangered Hedgehogs

By December most hedgehogs will be hibernating until around March/April. But some can still be active until January, in fact with winters getting warmer, hedgehogs in some areas may not hibernate at all. Baby hedgehogs (hoglets) born late in the year can struggle to find food and may be seen out in winter in need of help. Any hedgehog no matter how well it looks seen out in daylight in winter needs urgent help.

Hedgehogs often wake from hibernation and go looking for food, this is normal, they'll return to the gardens where they found food before hibernating. They'll only be active during the hours of darkness, while you sleep, so you may never know they've been. Help them, all winter, by leaving a shallow dish of water and one of dry kitten food in a feeding station.

If you accidentally disturb a hibernating hedgehog, cover it back over right away, leave food and water close by in case it comes out of hibernation. A hibernating hedgehog is unable to move and to the untrained eye can appear dead. It will feel cold and will only breath a couple of times a minute. It will be curled into a tight ball, prickles up with no face or legs showing - hedgehogs never die like that. So please never assume a hedgehog you find like this is dead. It takes anything from one to several hours for a hedgehog to wake from hibernation. If in doubt call a rescue for advice.

If you've been thinking about adding a hedgehog house to your garden, any time of year is a good time, even during winter.

Hibernation takes practice and young inexperienced first year hedgehogs very



often perish because they fail to build good enough nests to keep them protected from the elements and predators. The safety and extra warmth of a nice dry well-made wooden hedgehog house can be a life saver to them.

Being a Global Warrior is about knowing and understanding our world and having the right values, knowledge and skills to make the world a better place. It is about positive relationships and building safe, happy and healthy communities. At class circle time meetings, our pupils share and discuss ideas for ways to improve our school, which includes ways to improve the way we learn,

global and environmental issues and what we can do for others. e.g. Eco Schools, Fair-Trade, playground improvements, charities to support etc. Global Warrior meetings are held online through TEAMS which means all pupils can attend and not just Pupil Council class representatives. These meetings allow for on/offline breakout discussion and bring together class ideas to decide on the most effective ways to bring about change and improvements to our school, our environment, our community and beyond. Class representatives often take on the role of the spokesperson to share class discussions and views through TEAMs. We greatly value and respect the views of our pupils and the vital part they play in making decisions at school.

Following pupil presentations and class votes, our new **Pupil Council** members i.e. class representatives, have been appointed and were presented with their badges at assembly. Thank you to our **PSC** for providing the badges. Congratulations and well done to all of those elected.

We Decide...Children and Young People Voting for change-Participatory Budgeting-Success story for Fishermoss Primary 6 and Primary 7 Pupils!

Aberdeenshire Council commissioned Young Scot to manage an online vote for a participatory budgeting exercise. This was branded as the 'We Decide... Children and Young People Voting for Change event'. Schools were asked to consider the participatory budget theme of Climate Change & Carbon Reduction.

Primary Schools were encouraged to involve their Primary 6 & Primary 7 pupils to come up with exciting project ideas and apply for funding....and all Primary 6 & Primary 7 pupils at Fishermoss were involved. We went through an exercise with pupils to shortleet the suggestions made, and they submitted their application. The most voted for projects per cluster area (1 Academy and 2 Primary Schools) would be successful in securing funding for their project. We are delighted to say that our pupils' application was successful!

Our Senior Pupils had applied for funding for items which they felt would help pupils understand climate change and fight it. Their project was to secure funding for equipment but also to develop an understanding of the topics of climate change and the reduction of carbon through books and educating classes. Our Senior pupils felt that helping people to understand these topics, as well as taking direct action with planting and growing, will strengthen the school's commitment to them and make sure that all pupils coming through the school know how important interacting with the natural world is. The project will help our school become even more eco-friendly, and pupils aim to have a practical part (growing and planting) as well as an educational aspect through the creation of an Eco library which will help all our learners understand why interacting with the natural world and preventing climate change is so important. They believed this 'two pronged' approach would have the greater impact than just action alone.

They have successfully secured **£2000** for a composter, small greenhouse, garden equipment, planters, storage and an Eco Library. We are so very proud of their efforts to secure these funds.

'Children and Young People Voting for Change' vote was a success with a total of 696 voting young people in Aberdeenshire. A total of 18 exciting projects from across the area will be awarded funds to the collective value of £32,890 to support their work around climate change. Great to have this support for our young people to carry out exciting projects that young people have generated, examined, and democratically decided upon. This represents a great achievement from our young people. Fishermoss School valued the opportunity to be involved in this project and are of course delighted with the outcome.



#### International:


**Polio:** Rotary International has been working with other agencies for over 35 years to eradicate polio across the world, and with the virus having been found in the sewage systems in London and New York it is even more important to keep up this momentum. There are only two countries, Pakistan and Afghanistan, where polio is still endemic. With this in mind, our club has again contributed via #purpleforpolio by purchasing 4,000 purple crocus corms and distributing them via schools and community gardening groups throughout the community. All profit from this purchase goes to polio eradication.

**ShoeBox**: The Rotary Shoebox Scheme has been part of our club's International commitment for many years and again we have managed to distribute over 500 boxes to be filled by the community and sent to eastern Europe, in the past to Romania and Moldova but perhaps some of them may make their way into Ukraine this year. The schools have again been involved.

Alison Duncan had joined the Committee as Treasurer in 2021, and the committee which comprised at that time of Heather Yeoman, Damien Dennison and Joyce Burness, was bolstered by the addition of Morag Cairns, Veronica Muir, and Julie Hays who run the Fine Piece Café. Sandy Boath and, more recently Darren Robertson, also joined us and Committee now enjoys a new blend of skills and experience. That said, we really need a Committee Secretary and a Booking Clerk, so please do get in touch if you feel able to take on either (or both) of these roles (info@portlethenjubileehall.com).

As we emerge from the pandemic and people are once again gaining the confidence to meet, we have seen a dramatic rise in bookings. Regular lets include Jazzersize, Zumba Gold and a wide variety of activities for children and adults as well as an increase in the number of individual bookings for parties and weddings.

The **Fine Piece Café** re-opened for business and is going from strength to strength meeting every Wednesday morning. The recent introduction of bacon rolls has taken the offering to a whole new level.

**RAG BAG** – This is still proving popular. Your contributions of used clothing and shoes are very much appreciated – please remember to tie the shoes together in pairs and please put the clothes in suitable bags! Thanks to Heather Yeoman for organising this!

**PROJECTS** – We continue to upgrade the hall to widen its appeal to the entire community. We have hung new curtains, upgraded the hall lighting, and installed a more efficient air pump heating system. We are planning to level the car park to eliminate the water pools that form when it rains and improve the desperate shortage of storage space within the hall by placing an Offshore Container adjacent to the entrance. We are also planning to install Security Cameras, front and back. Finally, we plan to install a high-quality projector and sound system which would allow us to offer film evenings, training sessions and appeal to corporate functions. This equipment is very expensive, and we are looking at a variety of funding options to help us get this project up and running. When the "dust settles" after all these improvements, we will re-decorate the hall and re-varnish the floor!

**Breaking News**: Plans are afoot to host a **Lunch Club** to cater for people in our community with complex additional needs. The idea came from our café users, some of whom have additional support needs and physical disabilities. Many of these amazing people had their contact hours reduced during the pandemic and they now find it difficult to find places to socialise and enjoy group activities. We have applied for funding and were delighted to be awarded a significant sum to support the Lunch Club from the Meikle Carewe Wind Farm Community Fund. We are so grateful! Watch this space for news on our progress.

#### Talking (mainly) Rubbish – Cllr Mel Sullivan



Voters went to the polls on  $5^{th}$  May to choose their council representatives for the next five years. With Ian Mollison's retirement and the other incumbents either moving or not being successful, this means an entirely new team for North Kincardine.

On here you can find longer articles on things like recycling, and resources to help with the cost-of-living crisis, as well as the Trading Standards Bulletins, road closures and other bits and bobs.

Weekly news emails will continue to be sent out. These include the latest planning applications and other local items of interest. Please let me know if you would like to receive these. My email address is cllr.m.sullivan@aberdeenshire.gov.uk.

My first twelve weeks as a councillor have flown by. Many hours of training, many hours of meetings. Aside from full council and Kincardine and Mearns area committee, I'm also on Infrastructure Services, Waste Management, Live Life Aberdeenshire, Rapid Rehousing, Aberdeenshire South Access Panel and Kincardineshire Educational Trust. Of course, there are also two community councils to attend - three if Portlethen's starts up again. I'm still managing to support two families through Home-Start Aberdeen as a volunteer, but unfortunately my weekly stint behind the till at the Jubilee Hall's Fine Piece Café has been replaced by occasional appearances.

Some news for Portlethen - it has been confirmed that the following areas will be reconstructed with Hot Rolled Asphalt: T-junction at Fern Drive - Bruntland Road; T-junction at Bracken Road - Bruntland Road; Muirend Road - Cookston Road to Asda Roundabout.

A bin replacement scheme is underway. 'Diamond' bins need to be replaced. We are the only area in Scotland still using these, so they need to be swapped out for the kind everyone else uses, that way south Aberdeenshire doesn't need its own fleet of bin lorries that can't be used elsewhere. These bins are coming to the end of their projected 15-year lifespan anyway.

This process will be slow, so it started in the rural areas at the end of August, gradually making its way to the coastal urban areas (due here in the new year). This is to take advantage of decent weather in the harder-to-reach routes.

Old bins will be shredded and recycled into new bins. There will be plenty of advertising in the run up to the bin swap, including letters sent to residents two weeks beforehand. Your current bin will be emptied, then another lorry will collect it. A third will follow that day to leave your new bin. It is very important that your bin is left out on these replacement days, even if it's empty. Workers will be actively looking for bins, but obviously problems will be caused if they cannot locate and replace your bin on the day. Bins will be replaced on their normal collection days, so you will have two consecutive weeks when you'll need to put the appropriate bin out so that it can be replaced with the new style.

As I write this, the future of the booking system at Portlethen's recycling centre is uncertain. Each of the six areas in Aberdeenshire get to decide what to do over the next six months. The Kincardine and Mearns Area Committee will be deciding on this next week. I will be voting to retain the booking system, mainly because it would actually COST us money if trade waste were diverted away from trade waste centres. (With no booking system, it would be up to the household waste centre workers to identify and confront - traders trying to pass trade waste off as domestic.) By the time you read this, all household recycling centres will have started the system they will have during the trial six-month period. Centres will either be fully open, still under the booking system, or be trying a 'hybrid' option with some days/times being open without booking, but the rest of the time needing booked as usual.

#### **Covid Update**

I am sure everyone is aware of how quickly things change when it comes to Covid. We continue to work hard to ensure we keep our patients and staff safe. The wearing of face masks is still recommended in health care settings and we would encourage you to continue to wear a mask when visiting the practice.

We are currently reviewing our access policies and we hope that by the time this article is published that access to the practice will be much less restrictive than it has needed to be during the pandemic. Patients will still be reminded not to enter the practice if they are experiencing any Covid related symptoms. Arrangements are in place so patients can continue to be seen in a safe environment.

Patients with booked appointments will be encouraged to use the self service check in screen, leaving the front desk receptionist free to help patients with more complex queries. A queue management system will be in place.

In order to keep the footfall in the practice at safe levels we strongly encourage patients to telephone the practice to make appointments, request results and for any other patient requests. We will not be making appointment bookings at the front desk except for patients requesting review appointments following their consultation with the doctor.

#### **Repeat Prescription Requests**

Repeat prescription requests can be made in 2 ways. Patients can sign up for the online service ( the reception staff can help you with this) or they can hand in the repeat prescription order form. There is a post box in the vestibule of the practice building. The safest and most efficient method of dealing with repeat prescriptions is the on line service and we would like to encourage patients to use this service whenever possible.

Repeat prescription requests require 3 days for processing. Please ensure you have an adequate supply of your medication at all times. Our admin staff are available to deal with prescription enquiries between the hours of 9am and 5pm.

#### Flu and Covid vaccinations

The booster programme for both vaccinations is well under way. If you are eligible for these vaccinations and have not yet arranged your appointment please do so at your earliest convenience. You can contact the vaccination team to arrange an appointment on 0330 128 9919

#### Christmas and New Year Opening hours

The practice will close for the Christmas holiday on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> December at 6pm and re-open on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> December at 8.30am

We shall also close at 6pm on Friday  $30^{\rm th}$  December and re-open on Wednesday  $4^{\rm th}$  January at  $8.30 \, \text{am}$ .

For those who didn't know Mike that well, it may surprise you to know that Mike had been seriously ill during the latter part of his life. He had developed a cancer in the Kidney, and waited 5 years for a replacement, during which time he underwent dialysis 3 times a week. He was given a new kidney on 17th October 2021. A few days later Mike posted the following message on facebook- "It is working and my life will now change.......There is still a way to go, but let's look to the future."

Mike was recovering well, and continued his involvement in the community, until he was diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer in late April. This was a massive blow to his wife Alison, his 3 daughters, and his friends and family who had been on the journey with him. He will be sadly missed by us all, and impossible to replace.

He was a selfless individual who always took the time to ask how you were getting

on, regardless of what he was going through. He had an amazing sense of humour, and the photo opposite is how I will remember him. I am sure that he would have been very proud of his wife Alison, who has taken over as editor of the Clochandighter, and I wish her every success.

I will have fond memories of Mike....He was an inspiration to us all!!


