All Go For 865 (Portlethen) Squadron!

2023 has been a very busy year for 865 (Portlethen) Squadron so far!

In February, the squadron travelled up to RAF Lossiemouth for a training weekend with other squadrons in the Aberdeen area. Cadets took part in a variety of courses, including Bronze First Aid, Radio and Air Rifle shooting. They even paid a visit to the RAF Regiment where they got a presentation on the history of the regiment, and had fun with various stations set up for the cadets, such as a police search demonstration and practical exercise, a leadership and teambuilding exercise, and a look at some of the equipment used by the regiment.

Some 865 (Portlethen) Squadron cadets were also lucky enough to pay a visit to Bristow Helicopters in Aberdeen, to learn more about being a pilot, engineer, and many other careers the company has to offer. The cadets even got a flight in their state-of-the-art Helicopter Flight Simulator. This was a fantastic opportunity for the cadets to learn more about the field of aviation and possible future careers!





Since the start of spring, 865 (Portlethen) Squadron has also begun its Lowland walks again. The first walk took place in the grounds of Crathes Castle, and allowed the cadets to develop their navigation and map-reading skills. The second walk took place at Bennachie, where the cadets successfully climbed to the highest point of the hill, despite the very windy weather!

April saw 3 Cadets from 865 travel down to 661 VGS (RAF Kirknewton) for some gliding! Upon arrival, the cadets got a tour of the hanger and an up-close look at the gliders, followed by a shot in their glider flight simulator due to the unsuitable weather. However after the weather cleared up, all 3 cadets had a launch in the glider, and the experience was thoroughly enjoyed by all!

<u>Our Group's Projects</u> -<u>Portlethen Moss and Portlethen Community Woodland</u>

Portlethen Moss - Local Nature Conservation Site (LNCS)

At the time of writing this article (April), the frogs had been busy laying spawn since February. The peatland restoration work we've carried out helps to provide more habitat for our resident amphibians.

Some of you may have noticed the work we've been doing at the triangle on the edge of the moss on Broomfield Road, where we've planted lots of bulbs and native plants that thrive in the wet peaty soil there. We also planted some lovely wild roses and honeysuckle which will hopefully grow along the fence. The plants were all gifted to the group by the Greenspace Aberdeenshire project.

Sadly, the youths are back destroying an area where they're cutting down trees, building fires and leaving lots of litter. They have been approached and the police are aware.

Community Woodland

Along with our Aberdeenshire Council Ranger, we've been busy in the woodland over winter. The Council made repairs to the gate at the cemetery that leads into the woodland. We've planted up the new planter at the entrance from the church carpark into the woodland, with lots of lovely herbs, wild strawberries and a few primroses to attract early pollinators.





Two new signs, at the new wildlife garden area, have been installed thanks to our Ranger and Aberdeenshire Council Landscape Services.

The local scout group, at time of writing, are helping by preparing old wooden logs for the bug mansion.

We planted some wild roses, climbing plants, lots of wildflower plugs and seed bombs at a Ranger event in April. Hopefully there will be a nice display there in the coming months. The gateposts at the main entrance have seen better days, the Council has been notified that they need replacing.



Over the summer months, our group will be holding maintenance sessions on the first Tuesday of every month starting at 6:30pm, they will be spread between the woodland and moss sites.

If you'd like to help, please check our Facebook pages where we'll post information about which site we will be working on month by month.

New Community Garden (Garden on the Green)

The survey has now closed, we'd like to thank everyone who took the time to complete it and for your positive responses. Planning continues in the background, and it will be some time before any works commence. Thanks to everyone who has shown an interest in being involved in this new and exciting community project.

Saving Our Endangered Hedgehogs

By June hedgehog breeding season is well under way. Mothers alone will build the nursery nest and raise the hoglets. By 6 weeks old they will start to venture out on little foraging trips with mum and by 8 weeks the hoglets will venture off to start their own solitary independent lives, mums will often go on to have a second brood.

Over summer, if you're planning any garden projects, check carefully before you remove an old shed or pile of rubbish because there's a chance that a hedgehog could have made a nest underneath. They're very secretive and will nest in the most unexpected places, nests are often disturbed because people had no idea they were there.

If you do accidentally disturb a nest, cover it back over right away and observe from a distance. A mother can react very badly to being disturbed, and may abandon or even kill her hoglets especially if they are very young. Call us for advice.

Important info at a glance:

Hedgehogs need rescuing ASAP if seen out in the day when:

Lying around in the sun – hedgehogs do not sunbathe

On roads or pavements, wobbling or circling

Being pecked by birds

Surrounded by flies

Caught in netting

Found locked in a shed or garage etc

Fallen down a hole and become trapped

Allow hedgehogs into your garden, they

need access to a large number of mixed habitats, they do no harm, in fact they are the gardener's friend.

Always provide a shallow bowl of water – keep it topped up – water is life

They will thank you for a bowl of kitten kibble and or some wet cat or dog food

A key focus for schools is to prepare learners for their future pathways and the transition into the world of work. At Fishermoss School we are always looking for opportunities for our pupils to develop skills for learning, skills for life, and skills for work.

Primary 7 experienced a face-to-face Employability Workshop led by Pam Cumming from the University of Aberdeen, with a focus on careers and the skills required. **Primary 5** also experienced a workshop delivered by Pam on Marketing, as part of their class project on Charlie & the Chocolate Factory, where the class created their own chocolate bars and were keen to develop skills to help market them!

Primary 6 joined a live interview with the first British astronaut Helen Sharmar and a future astronaut based in the North of Scotland. They discussed what life was like in the International Space Station and what the future for space travel held. The pupils found out more about jobs related to the space industry both here on Earth and ones which involved space travel. Another great opportunity to Develop the Young Workforce!

Primary 3/4 enjoyed having an Aberdeenshire farmer visit them from the Royal Northern Countryside Initiative (RNCI) in collaboration with the Royal Highland Educational Trust (RHET). She talked about different types of farms in Aberdeenshire, and brought in props for the class to explore to help them understand more about daily life on a mixed farm. The class was interested to meet a farmer and to be able to ask questions! Pupils often associate farmers with males, so it was important to share that there are other farmers!

The youngsters from Fishermoss Primary heard from Dr. Samantha May, lecturer in the Department of Politics and International Relations at the School of Social Sciences, who helped them understand the basics of Scotland's political structure and how policies influence our everyday lives.

They visited the Zoology building and met with Dr. Elizabeth Campbell, School Education and Outreach Officer for the School of Biological Sciences, who spoke to them about science and the environment; and they heard about climate change from Dr. William Harcourt from the School of Geosciences.

Pupils then got a chance to tour the fluids laboratory at the School of Engineering's Meston building with Dr Mark Stewart and ,then get up close to the TAU Racing car. They also heard from students about what campus life is like, and took part in an employability workshop, encouraging them to think about some of the communication and interpersonal skills that are needed at college, university and in the world of work.

Pam Cumming, Schools Engagement Officer for the Business School, who organised the visit, said: "This is the latest event in a long-standing relationship we have with Fishermoss Primary, through which we work with the next generation of young minds to enthuse and inspire them about both the world around them and their future career choices. They were a fantastic group and we were delighted to be able to give them a flavour of what we teach at the University, and the breadth of opportunities available to them."

Fiona McRae, P6 teacher, said: "The pupils had a great visit to the University. It was so informative and included so many different areas, with a great emphasis on the relevance to everyday life and future careers. The insight into university life and studies has also given the children inspiration for the future, and some have already decided what they would like to study. It was an enjoyable day with something for everyone."



This is my last article for the Clochandighter. I arrived with my family in July 2017, almost six years ago! It has been a big change in my life and for my family, changing countries, adapting to a different culture and way of life. It's good to be a foreigner. You look at things around you and try to understand why things are done differently to how they are at home. Then, once you see beyond the cultural difference, you focus on what is really important in life: relationships. At the heart of the Christian faith is love. Love is beautifully defined by the apostle Paul in a famous passage from the Bible:

"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." (1Cor 13:4-8)

Love is Christianity's number one value. It's the best kind of relationship you can imagine, and it must be practised towards everyone. Jesus teaches us not only to love those who already love us, but also to love our enemies. It's a real challenge. I don't think that there are many of us who have enemies. In our society, and especially in a community like Portlethen, people tend to isolate themselves in their own homes, and many try to avoid their neighbours, as if they are afraid to see them, and even more so to invite them into their homes or to be invited. For this reason, the Christian mission is very difficult in our community. People have come to have a house, to park their car in front of it, and they are forced to get out to walk the dog, but they didn't come here to be in a community and participate in the community spirit (except for a small minority of them). In this context, finding people to run groups and charities has become an increasingly difficult challenge.

The Church, of course, is not exempt from this difficulty. I'm very grateful for all the wonderful people I've been surrounded by over the years of my ministry, who resist this spirit of our times and still believe in the importance of community. I would like to thank all the elders of Portlethen Church, and especially Alison Harris, who has been a valuable and reliable Session Clerk over the years of my ministry in Portlethen. I will keep Portlethen in my prayers as I move to another heaven with my family. And I thank God for all the blessings, especially the friendships, that my family and I have received during these six years of ministry.



The club has social events most months, and these can be found on our website. The next scheduled ones are a **Ladies Night** on 10th June and our **Fun Day** on 29th July.







It's hard to believe it's been one year since the council elections. In many ways it feels much longer, but I still have so much to learn!

By the time you read this, the new bin collection system will be up and running. The council has already secured a better price for the paper and cardboard that will be going into the blue bin, as it will be cleaner than before. PLEASE be careful what you put in each bin - the better we all recycle properly, the better for both the environment and the council's coffers.



No-mow May is being trialled in a few areas of Portlethen this year. This will support wildlife and enable the landscape team to work on other tasks. Feedback on how you think it went is welcome.

The Kincardine & Mearns Area Committee budget is accepting applications for 2023/24. We have £81,200 available to support local groups and projects - you can find the criteria and how to apply on the

council's website. At our first meeting of the new financial year, 14 applications totalling over £33,500 were approved, including £6,000 to the Portlethen and District Voluntary Community Ambulance and £2,000 to the Jubilee Hall.

I'm going to start with some good news.

PORTLETHEN & DISTRICT COMMUNITY COUNCIL

After a lot of work, by myself and some very hard working Portlethen residents, we now have the required number of names for our Portlethen & District Community Council (PDCC). It has taken me a year since I was elected as one of your councillors, to get this to a positive outcome. We needed 50 names, and we ended up with 41, which was accepted by the council. I thank every one of you that put your name to our list for believing in your community. We then had to receive 15 nominations of people who were prepared to go a step further and put their name in for committee places. We need seven minimum to form the basis of our PDCC and, we have a list of 11 from the council but, on our calculations, there should be 15 so I need to find out who has not had their nomination put forward. If you are one of the 15 and have not received the email from Emma Storey confirming that your nomination was received and explaining the next step, then get in touch with me at cllr.catherinevictor@aberdeenshire.gov.uk.

The next steps are crucial as there will be meetings to form the committee and carry things forward. There is a lot of help available from the council and other local Community Councils to get this group up and operating for the benefit of all residents in Portlethen and district. They will be pivotal in looking at all planning in the area, bringing the community's thoughts to the Council. Also bringing ro you the Council news that affects your area. There are a lot of grants that can be claimed through your Community Council for the benefit of the town, too. I look forward to working with the community through the PDCC as will all your Councillors. I would ask you to come along to meetings, they will be open to the public and it is a forum where you can voice your concerns, ideas etc. for your town. Keep an eye open for notification of when and where these meetings will take place. I will do my best to promote them on my Facebook Page: **Councillor Catherine Victor-North Kincardine.**

We, the K & M councillors, voted to allow a new Crematorium at Elsick in Chapelton. We did listen to concerns re road safety and put these vigorously to the planners at the meeting. In particular, we voiced people's concerns about the turn-off from the A92 onto the side road to Elsick House, when there is a large funeral cortege involved. We have been assured that the Roads Dept have done due diligence re road safety and are satisfied that all the roads in question will cope. There will be some road alterations involved, and I will keep you informed about those as we are notified. The Crematorium is well hidden away and designed to blend into the landscape and the hall by Elsick House should provide good community facilities when its completed. All in all, I think it will be a good addition to the area.

Expressive Arts Faculty - Rotary Young Musician of The Year 2023

The winning Team from Portlethen primary progressed to the next round and although they didn't win, they had a lot of fun. We are fully funding two places at the Rotary Youth Leadership Award **(RYLA)** week at Abernethy. This provides a recognised certificate for young people between 16 and 18 which can enhance their CV.

Service Above Self is the motto of Rotary International and Portlethen Rotary has certainly fulfilled that brief. From selling raffle tickets for Charlie House, to manning the water stations at the Chapelton Bike Ride, running several fundraisers to an elderly member doing a sponsored swim, we have raised a considerable sum for local groups. We also ran our Community Champion Award with Heather, the leader of the Newtonhill Out of School Club (Noosc) a deserving winner. We ran the BBQ at the Skateraw Fair last year despite having several call-offs through last minute illness, and hope to do so again. Thanks to Julia Coyle and fellow Rotarian Ian Dow for stepping in.

Socially we play an inter-club competition called The Gavel, with table games and lots of fun. We've enjoyed a Christmas meal at Poldino's, a Touch of Tartan night with haggis, and are looking forward to a night ten pin bowling at Codona's. All in all, we have fun while volunteering and making a difference. With the King asking us to volunteer more, we would love to see some new faces coming along to help.

I am a born and bred Stoney loon who, after several years away, came back home and am happily "retired" here at Kirktown of Fetteresso with my wife Sheila.

I started my time as an engineer at Hall Russell Shipyard at a time when we knew how to build ships in Scotland! I try to put my engineering experience to good use as I look after your Porty Medical Centre Ambulance. In addition, I sometimes drive if a regular driver cannot make their shift. I have been involved with the Ambulance for more than 5 years, and can say I really see first-hand the difference the service makes to the local community.

There is a great team spirit among the drivers and committee members, but the highlight is the recognition we receive from the patients. If anyone has some spare time, looking to make a difference in the community and get a few laughs, then driving the Ambulance may be the answer!

As our vehicle is so well-used, the time has come to upgrade to a newer model and, of course, this comes with a substantial cost. We transported elderly people to the Skateraw Hall for their lunch on a Friday, and for some of them this was the only time they went out in a week. We can only hope the community will be able to find volunteers to start it up again, as those elderly people are missing having a nice lunch and chat on a Friday, and we are happy to provide the transport.
