Editorial


Welcome to the Winter Edition of the Clochandighter. By the people of Portlethen, for the people of Portlethen.

The service operates weekly with an Aberdeenshire Council wheelchairaccessible minibus

Wednesdays: 9.45 – 14.30 hrs

The A2B service is open to:-

People who have difficulty walking

People with other disabilities

Residents who don't live near a bus stop or bus route.



If you think you need door-to-door transport you may qualify. We can take you anywhere within Portlethen e.g. shopping, medical centre, the library or to connect onto another bus service. You can ask for a trip at any time between 9.45 and 14.30 hrs, but you will need to fit in with other passengers. Phone us to find out more about the service.

All passengers have to be registered as an A2B member.

All trips must be pre-booked. Bookings can be made up to 7 days in advance, or up to 14 days for a medical appointment.



Our Group's Projects - Portlethen Moss, Portlethen Community Woodland, & Community Wildlife & Sensory Garden

Portlethen Moss - Local Nature Conservation Site (LNCS)

Nature, thankfully, can be so resilient, the habitat that the fires destroyed is slowly recovering. It will of course take years, and the poor wildlife affected such as nesting birds doesn't bear thinking about. We will continue to do our best to preserve the moss and with the Kincardine & Mearns Ranger we have plans, in the new year, to carry out more peatland restoration work. A local company has offered to volunteer with the Ranger, we always welcome offers of help from companies, it's a great rewarding team-building experience for them too.

Community Woodland

As the woodland continues to mature, we saw the first acorns and sweet chestnuts on some of the trees this year. There's lots of berries and hips to feed the hungry birds over winter and shelter for them in the hedgerows. Keep an eye out for the arrival of 'winter thrushes' - Fieldfares & Redwings and if we're lucky Waxwings. Newts and toads were found in the woodland this year confirming that the biodiversity we've worked hard to create is attracting a range of wildlife. The WW1 Memorial orchard is ready for winter, with the wildflower areas cut, seed allowed to set then the cuttings raked away. We sowed more yellow rattle which will help the wildflower areas to develop.

Community Wildlife & Sensory Garden

The wildflower meadow area in the garden is still in its infancy, but where we had 2 wild orchids last year, this year we had 17! Like the orchard in the woodland, we cut the area and have spread more yellow rattle seed. Our plan to create 2 more large sensory borders either side of the picnic bench came after the success of the lavender border that we created back in April, which has literally been buzzing with pollinators for months and the relaxing aroma of the lavender adds to the sensory theme. We planted more perennial wildflowers and honeysuckles in September, thanks to Greenspace Aberdeenshire for the plants. This project is still early days as we continue to improve and develop the wildflower meadow, we look forward to seeing it improve year on year.

We often see the toddlers of the Bourtree Nursey when we're working there, the staff told us that they really enjoy visiting the garden and do so at least three times a week.

Being a group member is neither onerous nor time consuming, we have 'hands on' events throughout the year that everyone is welcome to take part in. It's very rewarding, you can see the results of the work we do and you know that you're doing something really positive for our local environment.

Helping Our Endangered Hedgehogs

British hedgehogs have declined by between 30-75% in rural areas since 2000.



By now, most hedgehogs will be hibernating, however some will remain active, often right through December. These are the juvenile hedgehogs, born late in the year, as they struggle to gain enough weight to hibernate. With their natural diet of bugs and grubs very scarce and hard to find, especially if the ground is frozen, they need our help. Keep it simple, a shallow bowl of

water and one of dry kitten food, nothing else, beware of commercially-produced foods sold as 'hedgehog food' - they're unregulated and very often contain things that are harmful to our wild hedgehogs. Google searches on what to feed hedgehogs often pull up foods that are only suitable for pet hedgehogs - they're a different species with different dietary needs to our wild European Hedgehogs, and by providing dry kitten food you're giving them all the vital nutrients they require - high protein content and vitamins specially developed for mammals

There's no need to 'rescue' a hedgehog in winter unless it's out during the day. Rescues no longer overwinter every hedgehog that's active in winter, unless its poorly. Even small hedgehogs can and do survive hibernation, it's more to do with body shape than weight – for example a 500g small hedgehog will be perfectly proportioned, whereas an adult at 500g in winter will be a poorly one. If you see a hedgehog you're concerned about, get in touch with your nearest rescue for advice.

As always a hedgehog out in the day is not ok so if you see one, no matter how well it may look, 99.9% of the time it's a very poorly hedgehog and needs containing in a high sided box while you call The New Arc for advice Tel: 01358 701723.

Check out the Hedgehogs of Portlethen & Surrounding Area Facebook page where there's lots of information, use the search tab to look for information and if you don't find the answer you need send a message directly.

We are not a rescue, but can advise on how to help hedgehogs.



The summer is behind us now and the abundance of produce is still being eaten and shared by our members.

Since March, we have had an immense success in members developing their individual plots as per their own vision. This has created a wonderful array of different visual and growing results that has contributed to the site development this year. With the autumn now in full swing (as I write this), it is about planning for a next year to maximise the coming growing season.



It has been very heartening that all four schools in Portlethen have developed their plots with successes in producing a range of edible vegetables with any surplus given to the Larder.



Our youth club has also been involved with a patch on my plot to grow pumpkins for Halloween and, again, as I write this, they will have a good few to carve or raise funds with.

We are approaching our second AGM this November and will be looking to appoint new office bearers or re-elect

existing if they choose to continue. As from Early August we became a charity and have four trustees appointed in these roles to oversee and meet the legal requirements of being a charity.

Our site still has development and infrastructure tasks to do, and for which we still need funding, and this is an ongoing task driven by Colin Pike for which we are incredibly grateful.

Any help with funding from our local businesses would help us enormously in expanding community access and usage. It would go towards our infrastructure (toilets and complete access road, and recycling polycrub roof water in troughs on the North side). We are awaiting our accounts being finalised for this past year, necessary for all our funding applications going forward.

One of the latest initiatives has been to put in a note of interest to have the site taken over by us as an asset transfer from Aberdeenshire council. You may remember that the land was donated to the council as community land by the original house-builders back around 20 years ago.



We now have a waiting list for plots and a limited amount still available that are used for holding much needed topsoil and school materials. These plots will be released to the waiting list as soon as we can. You can put in a note of interest via our Facebook page.

I would like to thank all the members who volunteered and donated materials over the past few months and helped with weeding, planting bulbs, trees, and making compost bays.



I moved to Aberdeen from Edinburgh in 1980 to manage a motor factors. After eight years, I moved into sales, supplying products

to garages and body shops, where I stayed for 32 years. My wife Annie and I settled in Portlethen in 1982, where we raised our two boys, Iain and Ewan.

Outside of volunteering, my main passions are genealogy, photography, and music. I've traced parts of my family history back as far as the late 1600s. I also play Scottish traditional music on the harmonica and Scottish small pipes which are like Highland pipes but quieter, with bellows instead of lungs providing the air - a blessing at my age! My wife might not appreciate all the practice, though -I've occasionally been sent out to the summerhouse with them.

I first joined the Community Ambulance team back in 2021, thanks to a chance chat with my neighbour, Colin Stratton, who was then Chairperson of the association. After the usual talk about the weather, he asked if I was retired and under 70. When I said yes, he suggested I consider driving for the local ambulance once a week. I liked the idea of giving something back to the community, so I agreed.

Initially, I was on the list of relief drivers, but almost straight away a Wednesday afternoon slot became available—and I've been doing it ever since. At first, my role involved transporting patients to and from the Medical Centre. With Covid restrictions in place, things were fairly quiet, which gave me a chance to get used to the routine.

As restrictions lifted, the Young at Heart Club restarted on Wednesday afternoons at the Community Centre, and I began taking members there and back. The club offers local seniors a chance to meet up for tea, biscuits, games, craft activities, guest speakers, and even music from Portlethen Academy pupils. They're a lively, welcoming group who often include me in their activities—and they've even invited my wife along on occasion.

I am also responsible for arranging the transportation and logistics for outings for various local groups including the residents of Brio Retirement Living at Chapelton, Newtonvale Sheltered Housing, and the Newtonhill Lunch Club at the Bettridge Centre.

One of the unexpected pleasures of volunteering has been getting to know the lovely team of volunteers who make the Young at Heart Club possible. There's always a need for more helping hands, whether as ambulance drivers or club helpers—and I can promise it's both rewarding and fulfilling work.

Our charity is always dependent on donations from individuals, local organisations, and businesses to keep the Wee Blue Bus on the road. We would like to thank the Leathan pub for their generous donation of £600 raised from



Dunnottar Pipes and Drums: A year of 'firsts'



Dunnottar Pipes and Drums' hectic 2025 summer season closed at Pitlochry Highland Games, on 13 September. It was the first time the band had been invited to this prestigious event of the highland games calendar and capped off what has been a year of 'firsts'.

The start to 2025 was mainly spent working on tunes, kit and instruments. Our first public engagement, following the Stonehaven Fireballs at Hogmanay, was playing to the 'Cycling for Doddie' team as they breezed into Stonehaven on February 7 after a leisurely 88-mile bike ride from Blairgowrie.

A number of pipers from the band took part in the Royal Scottish Pipe Band Association's (RSPBA) Quartets Competition in Huntly in March, and then it was on to the first of many 'firsts' this year – the entire band's initial competition, at the RSPBA Championship in Banchory in May.

The band gave a great account of itself and was awarded fourth place. Even better, the Drum Corps picked up an awesome first place against stiff competition - a superb start.

This 'first' became a theme as we played in four more competitions through the summer before the World Championships: the Aberdeen Highland Games, the Garioch Pipeband competition in Inverurie, the UK championships at Ingliston, and the RSPBA event in Mintlaw.

The band placed creditably in all these competitions but a huge shout-out is due to



the Drum Corps, which was awarded first place at each of these events - a phenomenal achievement. This resulted in them becoming regional champions. Their journey to becoming the Real Madrid of North East Scotland's Grade 4B drum sections was complete.



In August, the band embarked on its first competing trip to the World Pipeband Championships in Glasgow. We were delighted to take part in this huge extravaganza that draws 207 bands, including the cream of the piping world, to compete for the ultimate prize – to become World Champions in bands' respective categories, from Grade 1 to Grade 4B.

Bands travel from far-flung corners of the globe: France, Austria, the US, Canada, Australia, Oman, Zimbabwe, New Zealand. Even Peterhead.

Although not in the prize list the band acquitted itself extremely well and can be satisfied with competing in such a distinguished event. It was a long day – a 5.20 am start and a return back to Stonehaven around 10.30 pm - but to be part of it was fantastic.

As well as all this, the band continued to perform regularly at community events such as the opening of the Stonehaven Outdoor Swimming Pool, the Stonehaven Feein' Market, the Celebrate Aberdeen Parade, and Duthie Park Open Day.

Another 'first' saw the band as the initial customers of Stonehaven's Land Train, as we piped on it while it sped through the streets after a three-year hibernation. As a bonus, playing the pipes and drums whilst packed into the confined spaces of the land train introduced contortionism into the band's skill set.

The band also played at the Braemar Gathering, Aboyne Highland Games, Stonehaven Highland Games and Drumtochty Highland Games, in unusually pleasant conditions throughout the summer.

Dunnottar Pipes and Drums is having a well-earned short break from public performance before returning in November for winter events like Remembrance Sunday, the Switch-on of Stonehaven's Christmas Lights and of course, the Hogmanay Fireballs.



She will be sorely missed. I notice that she is not giving up all her civic duties though and her treasury skills are now being utilised by the Portlethen Town Association [and the Clochandighter - Ed].

It was my pleasure to present Alison with an Aberdeen City Gift Card on behalf of the Hall Committee.



In other news, we continue on our conversion to be a Scottish Charitable Integrated Organisation. Our application documentation is well under way, and I hope to submit the significant volume of paperwork in the next few weeks.





Pupils were astounded to hear and see some of the interactions in real-time, and we know this will be a very memorable experience for them. Some of their testimonials are below:



Portlethen Local Place Plan Survey - Interim Update & Next Steps

Thank you to everyone who took part in the Portlethen Local Place Plan survey! By the time you read this, the interim update, the survey, will be closed. Hopefully you took part and made sure your insights help shape the future of our community.

Why we asked for your feedback

Your feedback will help us identify priorities for:

- Community facilities and amenities
- Green spaces, parks, and play areas
- Transport links, walking routes, and cycling paths
- Housing, development, and design quality
- Local economy, skills, and employment opportunities

We'll use aggregated findings to draft the Local Place Plan, which will be finalised and published by April 2026. Your feedback will directly inform funding bids, planning applications, and community-led initiatives over the next decade.

Interim Findings

With 26 responses received at time of writing, several clear themes have emerged:

- Top priorities: Community facilities, transport and connectivity, youth and education, green spaces, and local economy.
- Progress since 2019: Most respondents feel only "somewhat" or "no" progress
 has been made on previous priorities, especially youth activities and public
 transport, and the key themes from the 2019 Community Action Plan are still
 important to the community.
- Recurring suggestions: Calls for a stronger town centre identity, improved public transport, better parks and green spaces, activities for youth, and support for local businesses.
- Concerns: Litter, road maintenance, and the need for a community hub are frequently mentioned.

Next Steps for Portlethen

- Survey responses will be analysed and key themes identified.
- A public workshop will be held to discuss draft recommendations.
- The Local Place Plan will be finalised and published by April 2026.
